Each ring is individually crafted by Roosegaarde's team in the Netherlands and unique in the world. The new Beijing version of the ring accommodates more smog than its predecessor from Rotterdam. The Smog Free Project reflects Roosegaarde's ethos for a clean future, whereby citizens are part of the solutions instead of the problem.

ABOUT THE SMOG FREE PROJECT

The Smog Free Project can be visited seven days a week throughout the month of October 2016 at 751's Power Square adjacent to 798 in Beijing, China. The project serves as inspiration for a clean future, enabling citizens, governments and NGO's and clean tech players to create new smog free solutions. The project is supported by the Chinese Ministry of Environmental Protection and consists of the Smog Free Tower and Smog Free Jewellery; its opening in Beijing marks the start of its China and its world tour.

The Smog Free Tower cleans 30.000m3 per hour via patented ozone-free ion technology and uses a small amount of green electricity. The Smog Free Tower captures and collects more than 75% of the PM2.5 and PM10 airborne smog particles and releases clean air around the tower with a 360-degree coverage creating an almost circular zone of clean air in its surrounding.

More than 80% of people in urban areas are exposed to air quality levels that exceed World Health Organization limits. The Smog Free Project is a part of Roosegaarde's larger oeuvre 'Landscapes of the Future' which connects people, technology and space to improve the quality of daily life in urban environments.
