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

GIOVANNI VACCARINI ARCHITETTI. RIVIERA 107 BUILDING IN PESCARA, ITALY.

- The new residential building designed by Giovanni Vaccarini on the Pescara seafront revisits the theme of the Adriatic *palazzina* (apartment building) with a refined and brilliant interpretation.
- Working out the depth of the surfaces, a theme that has long marked Vaccarini's research, leads to the transformation of the main elevation: a sort of open section puts the interiors in a direct and exclusive relationship with the view of the Adriatic coast.
- At street level, the building is set back, thus allowing the sidewalk to expand into the interior of the block and amplifying the relationship with the public space. Seen from below, the reflective metal soffits of the variably cantilevered floors provide an unexpected façade backdrop that helps define the urban scene.

A residential project conceived as an urban regeneration effort. The building respects the limits of the lot, but reinterprets the relationships between the interior, the landscape, the public space. Giovanni Vaccarini has recently completed a building on the seafront of the city of Pescara that he describes as a piece of the widespread conurbation of the Adriatic coast. An elegant building, perfectly inserted in the urban fabric, which reinterprets the typology of the *palazzina* (apartment building), to which the architect, based in this city, has been dedicating his research and studies for some time.

"Pescara is an American city in Italy," recalls Giovanni Vaccarini quoting Italian journalist and writer Guido Piovene who, in his "Viaggio in Italia" ("Journey through Italy"), defined the capital of Abruzzo as a linear city, without a real center, born from the confluence of people of the region who moved from the mountains to the coast in search of work and better living conditions. A dream that sounds a lot like the American dream. In fact, notes Vaccarini, the city has been able to attract investments, people

and activities, and in just a few years it has become the economic hub of the region and the mid-Adriatic area.

Pescara is a very young city, less than one hundred years old, but it has grown in the post-war period at such a rapid pace as to give rise to strong contrasts, recognizable along its streets. It is the city of the "vitelloni", as described by Italian playwright and novelist Ennio Flaiano, who was born here: a bunch of lazy guys who spent their time in the clubs of the seaside town. But, at the same time, it is an industrious city, inhabited by a thriving and budding entrepreneurship that today has taken on national and international dimensions.

The project is located in a portion of the city that clearly speaks of this tumultuous growth: some surviving Art Nouveau or neoclassical villas are flanked by imposing buildings, often lacking in quality. Some villas, through the years, were quickly replaced by the rampant palazzina (apartment building) type. A single block typology, served by a central vertical distribution around which the apartments - two or more per

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floor - are arranged. This is the context in which Vaccarini's project is located.

"The palazzina is a representation of the profound transformations that have taken place in the city: it is not a palazzo, since it does not have the size nor the urban role, and it is not even a villino, the small one- or two-family building. It is a hybrid, a deformation that has disrupted the established relationship between building type and urban morphology in the historic city."

to the public domain, is thus
opposite to the service band,
which includes the vertical
distribution, bathrooms,
kitchens, laundries, and further
back the more private quarters
with bedrooms and studios.
Following this logic, the
building further develops its

dialogue with the surrounding environment. The front of the building is set back from the street edge, and thus defines a semi-public space of mediation between the public and the private spaces. A kind of sidewalk expansion that the building shares with the city. The hallway becomes the collective place par excellence, flanked by a communal space for meetings, parties all those common activities that may be necessary in a condominium.

More than anything else, this distribution layout allowed an original transformation of the seafront overlook. The east-facing facade, in fact, is conceived as a real open section of the building, along which the floors of the building cantilever. The compact volume is thus dissolved in a way and the floor plates "slip" outwards. The shifting of the planes and the cantilevers that iut out towards the sea define a portion of open-air dwelling, a sort of trabocco urbano, explains Giovanni Vaccarini, referring to the traditional trabocchi - wooden structures for fishing that characterize the local coastline. This choice allows the interiors to attain a direct and unconditional

relationship with the sea view. An intense relationship with the city and the landscape, with light and outdoor life, is at the heart of the project. The main rooms of the apartments enjoy direct views and all have outdoor terraces, designed as real open-air rooms, an integral part of domestic life.

The soffit of the cantilevered balconies is made of a perforated brass cladding. Seen

from below, as one walks along the promenade, the series of reflective overhangs gives rise to a sort of unprecedented fifth elevation of the building that helps to define the urban scene.

Environmental sustainability and design strategies

Riviera 107, designed by Giovanni Vaccarini Architetti and engineered by Proger Spa, responds to principles of bio-architecture and ecocompatibility. The facades facing south and north, which are more exposed to the action of summer sunshine and the action of cold winter winds, have small openings. The east elevation is fully glazed and protected from direct sunlight by overhangs measuring between 2,5 and 3,5 meters. The west side has full-height apertures and is protected by an overhang of 1,5 meters, so that interior spaces can take advantage of the weak afternoon sunlight. A zero Co2 emission energy station is powered by a high efficiency heat pump system. FSC-certified timbers as well as materials and finishes that follow the LCA (Life Cycle Assessment) methodology were used to construct Riviera 107; also, wherever possible, the design team employed recyclable, renewable and materials sourced within the region. A plan for the management and collection of recyclable materials has been implemented. The terraces and roof garden are planted using local species that require little water so as to minimize the bio-economic impact. The building is designed and built to achieve an A+ Energy Class rating.

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Giovanni Vaccarini Architetti

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Giovanni Vaccarini graduated with honors in Architecture from the "Gabriele D'Annunzio" University of Pescara in 1993. In 1994 he took a post-graduate specialization course in landscape architecture at University of Waterloo School of Architecture in Ontario. Canada. He holds a PhD in architectural composition. Svolge attività didattica e di ricerca come Visiting Professor presso facoltà di architettura ed ingegneria italiane. He is visiting professor at several Italian faculties of architecture and engineering. He was adjunct professor in Architectural Composition at the School of Architecture and the "Gabriele D'Annunzio" University of Pescara.

He founded Giovanni Vaccarini Architetti in 1993.

Architecture is born from ideas, not from form; form is the outcome of the staging of these ideas. His office, a laboratory of research and experimentation with 25 years of experience, focuses its research on reaffirming the primacy of ideas over form. Research, design and construction are the components of the very same vision.

In 2021 he is awarded the INARCH Abruzzo award, the INARCH Emilia Romagna award and the special national Willis Towers Watson prize. In 2020 he is the recipient of The Plan Award, category: Production. In 2018 he is the recipient of The Plan Award, category: Sports and leisure. In 2017 he is among the winners of the Architizer Award. In 2016 the project for the new Headquarters of SPG Société Privée de Gérance was awarded the "Prix Bilan de l'Immobilier" in the "rénovation" category. He is recipient of the lakov Chernikov prize at the 2015 Sofia Architecture Triennial in Bulgaria. In 2012 he received the Premio Ad'A, Architetture dell'Adriatico.

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
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
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


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
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


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




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
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
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
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
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
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


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
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
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
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
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
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




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
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
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
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
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


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


File name: Riviera 107 - DIA 01 Caption: Giovanni Vaccarini Architetti, Riviera 107, Pescara, Italy. Typological layout.

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
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

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Pescara, Italy. 4th floor plan (typical floor plan).


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
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


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
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
