The Glass House, built between 1949 and 1995 by architect Philip Johnson, is a National Trust Historic Site located in New Canaan, CT. The pastoral 49-acre landscape comprises fourteen structures, including the Glass House (1949), and features a permanent collection of 20<sup>th</sup>-century painting and sculpture, along with temporary exhibitions. 

## 1. GLASS HOUSE

- Completed 1949
- Glass and painted steel, 1,728 square feet

## 2. BRICK HOUSE

- Completed 1949
- Wood frame construction with exterior brick cladding, 988 square feet
- Newly restored

## 3. POOL

- Completed 1954 - 1955
- Concrete with granite deck

## 4. PAINTING GALLERY

- Completed 1965
- Masonry and earth berm construction, 3,778 square feet

## 5. SCULPTURE GALLERY

- Completed 1970
- Brick masonry construction with skylight roof system, 3,650 square feet

## 6. OZYMANDIAS, JULIAN SCHNABEL

- Completed 1990
- Cast bronze, patina, paint
- Edition of 2, cast 1 of 2

## 7. UNTITLED, DONALD JUDD

- Completed 1971
- Poured concrete

## 8. LIBRARY STUDY

- Completed 1980
- Masonry construction, 384 square feet

## 9. GHOST HOUSE

- Completed 1984
- Chain link and steel, 346 square feet

## 10. PAVILION

- Completed 1962
- Pre-cast concrete; exterior 6.5 feet high, interior 5.75 feet high

## 11. LINCOLN KIRSTEIN TOWER

- Completed 1985
- Painted concrete block, 30 feet high

## 12. DA MONSTA

- Completed 1995
- Modified gunite construction, 990 square feet

## 13. SHIGERU BAN: PAPER LOG HOUSE

- Completed 2024
- Paper tubes, wood, and milk crates, 185 square feet
- Designed by Shigeru Ban Architects
